## TOMB OF THE UNKNOWN SOLDIERS

**How many steps does the guard take during his walk across the tomb of the Unknowns and why?**

21 steps! It alludes to the twenty-one gun salute, which is the highest honor given any military or foreign dignitary.

**How long does a sentinel hesitate after turning to begin the return walk and why?**

The sentinel marches 21 steps across the black mat, past the final resting places of the Unknown Soldiers of World War I, World War II, Korea, and the crypt of the Unknown Soldier of the Vietnam War. With a crisp turn, the sentinel turns 90 degrees to face east for 21 seconds. The sentinel then turns a sharp 90 degrees again to face north for 21 seconds. A crisp "shoulder-arms" movement places the rifle on the shoulder nearest the visitors to signify that the sentinel stands between the tomb and any threat. After the moment, the sentinel paces 21 steps north, turns and repeats the process.

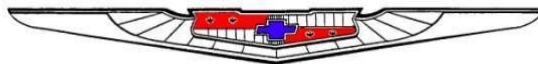

**HILTON HEAD ISLAND, SC** – Organizers for the Hilton Head Island Concours d’Elegance & Motoring Festival presented grants throughout the past week to local community organizations who, in turn, offered services to help manage last year’s record-breaking Motoring Festival. In total from the 2009 Festival, over \$15,000 was contributed to local organizations and scholarship programs.

At the Festival’s first Managers Meeting for the year held last week, checks were presented to both the Hilton Head Island High School Band Boosters, whose Jazz ensemble played during the Sunday Concours d’Elegance, and the Junior Leadership program that provided students to serve as greeters for the event.

At the recent Heroes on Horseback Kentucky Derby Party on Saturday, May 1, Dr. Paul Doerring, Chairman of the Driving Young America committee, the Motoring Festival’s charitable fund, presented a check to Heroes on Horseback for their help in staffing the Driving Young America tent on-site at the Festival. And, just this past Monday, May 3, Carolyn Vanagel, the event’s Executive Director, presented a check to the Hilton Head Symphony Orchestra for their program with the Boys & Girls Club of Hilton Head Island that will provide recorders for students.

“We are thrilled that we are able to give back to the community through those organizations that have directly supported the mission of the Motoring Festival, especially in this continuing difficult economic climate,” said Carolyn Vanagel, Executive Director. “We hope that our contributions will continue to grow year after year.”

The Motoring Festival, in an effort to continue to grow its charitable contributions, has developed a couple of opportunities for individuals to help support its charitable mission.
